

Glossary:

- City: a large settlement where many people live and work
- Human feature: built by people e.g. houses, roads and bridges
- Location: the place or position of an area
- Physical feature: natural aspects of the environment like seas, mountains and rivers. They would be here even if there were no people around
- Population: the total number of people living in a country, city, or other area
- Region: a large space or area
- Town: an area with streets, houses, and buildings that is larger than a village but usually smaller than a city
- Village: a small town or community, often in the country
- Landscape - all the visible features of an area of land
- Capital City - where the government operates from.
- Urban - in or relating to a town or city.
