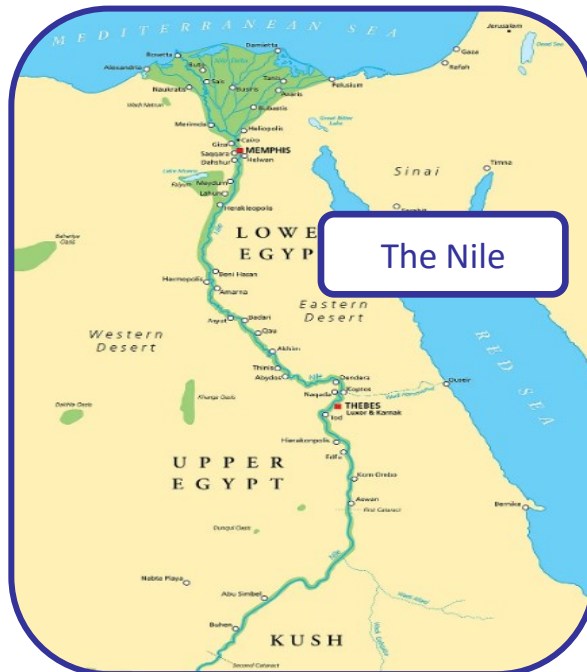
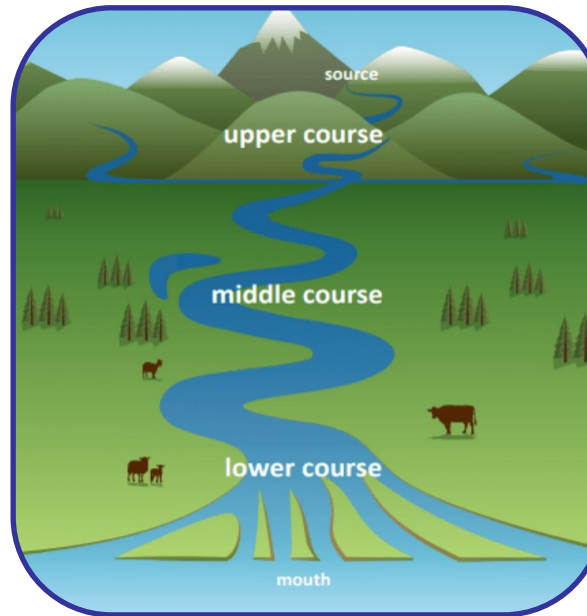


Geography Summer - Year 3- How does a river change from source to mouth?

Glossary:

- River - a flowing, moving stream of water
- Continents- is a large solid area of land
- Symbols - one object or thing stands in the place of something
- Source - the start of a river is it's source
- Water cycle - the continuous journey of water from oceans and lakes, to clouds, to rain, to Streams, to rivers and back into the ocean again
- Evaporation - happens when a liquid turns into a gas
- Condensation - process by which a gas (water vapour) turns back into a liquid
- Precipitation - any liquid or frozen water that forms in the atmosphere and falls to the Earth
- Meander - a bend in a river channel
- River Basin—an area of land drained by a river and its tributaries
- Erosion - the way a river wears away at the riverbank
- Deposition - when a river wears away at riverbank
- Riverbed - the bed is the bottom of a river and can be made of sand, rocks or mud
