



Glossary:

Deforestation – the action of clearing a wide area of trees.

Logging - the activity or business of felling trees and cutting and preparing the timber.

Hydroelectric - relating to or denoting the generation of electricity using flowing water

Desertification - the process by which fertile land becomes desert, typically as a result of drought or deforestation.

Erosion - the process of eroding or being eroded by wind, water, or other natural agents.

Sustainable - able to be maintained at a certain rate or level.

Ecological footprint - the impact of a person or community on the environment, expressed as the amount of land required to sustain their use of natural resources.

Import - bring (goods or services) into a country from abroad for sale.

Export - send (goods or services) to another country for sale.

Economic – considered in relation to trade, industry, and the creation of wealth.


Trade - the action of buying and selling goods and services.
