

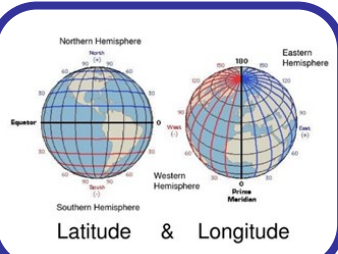

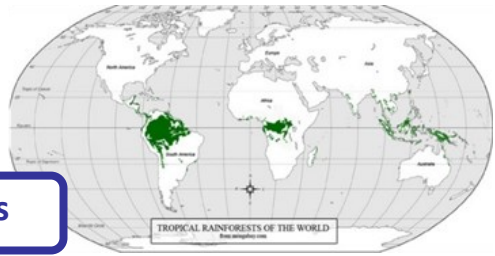

Palm oil, from the fruit of the palm tree.

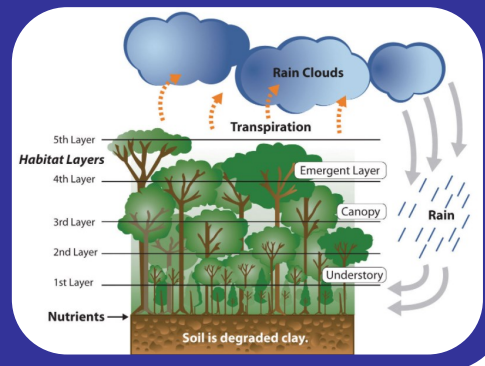


Tropical Rainforests

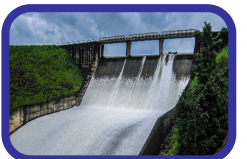


Glossary:

- Deforestation** – the action of clearing a wide area of trees.
- Logging** - the activity or business of felling trees and cutting and preparing the timber.
- Hydroelectric** - relating to or denoting the generation of electricity using flowing water
- Desertification** - the process by which fertile land becomes desert, typically as a result of drought or deforestation.
- Erosion** - the process of eroding or being eroded by wind, water, or other natural agents.
- Sustainable** - able to be maintained at a certain rate or level.
- Ecological footprint** - the impact of a person or community on the environment, expressed as the amount of land required to sustain their use of natural resources.
- Import** - bring (goods or services) into a country from abroad for sale.
- Export** - send (goods or services) to another country for sale.
- Economic** – considered in relation to trade, industry, and the creation of wealth.
- Trade** - the action of buying and selling goods and services.
- Manufactured** – produced on a large-scale using machinery.
- Global Scale** – in relation to the whole world.
- Indigenous** - occurring naturally or originating in a place.

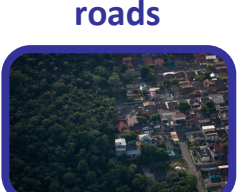
