
## Year 5 Spring - History - Why was an English navy fleet needed during Tudor times and how successful was it?




## **Glossary:**

- Monarch: the head of a state, such as a king, queen or emperor
- Merchant: a person or company involved in trade, dealing with other countries supplying and receiving goods
- **Fleet:** a group of ships which sail together
- **Portrait:** a painting, drawing, engraving or photograph of a person
- Flagship: the ship in a fleet deemed to be most important and which carries the navy leader
- Reign: to rule as a King or Queen
- **Gunport:** an opening on the side of a ship
- Preservation: the act of keeping something in its original state
- Archaeology: the study of history and prehistory through site excavation and artefact analysis
- Hull: the main body of a ship
- Artefact: an object of historical significance or interest
- New World: a term referring to North, Central and South America following their discovery
- **Privateer:** an armed person or armed ship undertaking a government duty which was authorised to attack if necessary
- **Armada:** a fleet of warships
