


Sticky Knowledge:

Glossary:

- **Enslaved person:** a person forced to work for no pay, to follow commands and to be without freedom of movement and choice.
- Transatlantic: crossing the Atlantic
- **Plantation:** an estate on which crops such as sugar, coffee and tobacco are grown
- Underground Railroad: secret routes and safe houses which assisted enslaved people in escaping their masters.
- Emancipation Proclamation: a declaration made by President Lincoln to end slavery in the United States of America
- Abolish: to formally end something.
- **Legislation:** laws that are in place or introduced.
- Benin Bronzes: a collection of statues, sculptures and plaques from the Kingdom of Benin.
- **Discrimination:** unfair treatment of people based on different characteristics such as race and ethnicity.
- Civil rights: the rights of citizens to political and social freedom and equality
- **Segregation:** the act of separating people based on race.
