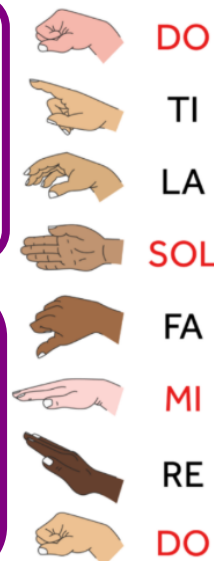


The famous White Cliffs of Dover stand guard at the Gateway to England.

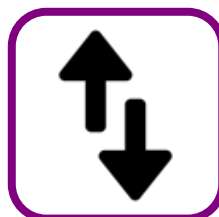

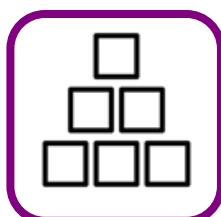

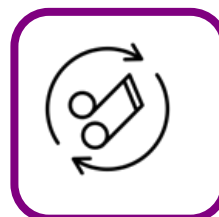
